Regular cost - \$1400 per person, double occupancy*, booked after June 30, 2026

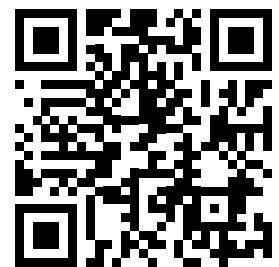
